My Advice To You Is

On the one hand, you should recognize the important role that the LSAT plays in the admissions process. On the other hand, don't blow it out of proportion. Your goal should be to score high enough so that you won't be rejected from law school because of your LSAT score. Prepare responsibly. In an ideal world, you should take the LSAT the first June that you are free.

Like it or not the Law School Admission Test ("LSAT") has a well established and important role in the law admissions process. I have taught LSAT courses for more than twenty years. Those years of experience have allowed me to give you some excellent introductory advice. This Appendix is not intended to be a complete LSAT book. But, it will get you moving in the right direction. Furthermore, it will show you how to PREP for the LSAT in the most effective way.
